Two breaches in embankment, 15 villages in Shahkot submerged

SHAHKOT (JALANDHAR), JULY 11
Two breaches in Dhussi bundh along the Sutlej inundated as many as 15 villages in Shahkot today.

As the river was in full spate, the first breach occurred at Nasirpur village and then it damaged the bundh at Gatta Mundi Kasu village. Both the breaches were up to 150 ft and 60 ft, respectively.

The State Disaster Relief Management, the National Disaster Relief Management and the administration deployed seven motorised boats today to evacuate the people trapped in submerged villages. Even MP Balbir Singh Seechewal and his volunteers were assisting in relief and rescue operations.

Deputy Commissioner Vishesh Sarangal said, "More than 3.25 lakh cusecs of water was released into the Sutlej in the past two days. It led to flooding in 15 villages. Our immediate target is to rescue the people."

"So far, nearly 200 people from Mundian Chohlian, Mundian Shehrian, Chak Bundala, Pipli, Miani, Chak Rajewal, Ismailpur, Janian, Janian Chahal, Darewal and Kang Khurd have been brought to the rescue camps and provided food," he said,

adding that six more boats would be pressed into the service to rescue people.

"Once the river current slows down, we we can start plugging the bundhs," said Sarangal.

Gurbir Dhillon of Seechewal's team said, "The MP has

deployed machinery to bring sand at the site. Once the sacks are filled, we will load them in an iron mesh and start plugging the breach. The whole process may take at least three weeks."

The water also entered 14 villages in Sultanpur Lodhi.

22-year-old swept away

A youth from Mundi Cholian lost his life after he was swept away in flood waters on Monday night.

The youth, Arshdeep Singh (22), had returned from Greece around four months ago. He is survived by his mother, father and two siblings. All of them are abroad except Arshdeep's mother.

His uncle said Arshdeep had dropped his mother at a nearby village so that she could be safe. "After dropping her at the village, he went back to take his clothes from his house at Mundi Cholian village when his bike got stuck. The moment he got off the bike, he was washed away due to the heavy flow of water," said Kulwant Singh, his paternal uncle.

Shocked at her son's demise, his mother said she had asked Arshdeep not to go back and remain with her, but he did not listen to her. — TNS

Water released from Harike, border villages bear the brunt

FEROZEPUR, JULY 11
For the third consecutive day, Kaluwala village which is surrounded by the Sutlej from three sides remained submerged in water. Around 60 families have taken shelter at the government primary school in the village.

Adding to the woes of the villagers, there has been no electricity and potable water. Rattan Singh and Chiman Singh of Kaluwala village said they had been waiting for the help for the last three days.

Jiwan Singh, another resident, said, "We are feeling helpless along with our kids and women. One of them is even pregnant. We are worried due to the rising level of water."

Janjeer Singh, a farmer, said their crops and agricultural equipment had got inundated.

Around 50 farmers of Dona Mathar village had a narrow escape as they went to their fields on a wooden boat. Due to heavy discharge of water, the boat

lost control and started heading towards Pakistan.

A youth identified as Paramjit Singh, who sustained injuries following collapse of his house at Habib Wala village, was admitted to the hospital by the administration.

According to information, 2.13 lakh cusecs of water was released from Harike headworks downstream. The pond level of Harike was reported at 685 ft at 6 pm today. Deputy Commissioner Rajesh Dhiman along with senior officials visited Gajniwala and Dona Mathar. He said the water was being released from Harike and Hussainiwala headworks to avoid any untoward situation.

"The administration is ascertaining the loss of crops in affected areas, including Hussainiwala, Mamdot, Guruharsahai, Zira and at other places. We are trying to rescue stranded people with the help of the BSF, the NDRF and the Army. So far, 15 relief camps have been set up in the district," said Dhiman.

Flood threat looms in Fazilka

FAZILKA, JULY 11
After the authorities released 1,21,656 cusecs of water from Hussainiwala headworks today, border villages situated across Kawan Wali Pattan bridge in Fazilka district are under threat of flooding.

The flood-prone villages include Jhangar Bhaini, Gulaba Bhaini, Retewali Bhaini, Chak Rohela, Dhani Sadda Singh, Mohar Jamsher, Kanwan Wali, Dilawar Bhaini and Teja Rohela among others. The residents of these villages were moving to safer places along with their belongings and livestock.

According to information, the water has entered low-lying areas along the Sutlej. Sources said as the water had touched Kawan Wali Pattan bridge, contact with 12 villages might get broken.

Janak Singh of Mohar Jamsher village said, "The water of the Sutlej has entered the fields. Paddy, moong and green fodder have submerged." — OC

Patiala villages still waterlogged, rescue work picks pace

PATIALA, JULY 11
Hundreds of villages and four colonies in Patiala have continued to suffer due to water-logging in their areas.

With water levels receding and sun out for most of the day today, the administration feels that the flood situation is expected to improve within 24 hours.

Residents in Urban Estate, Sanjay Colony and Chinar Bagh had anxious moments as flood water from the overflowing Badi Nadi continued to gush in and it's almost six to 10 feet at certain places, forcing people to shift to the first floor of their houses without power and drinking water.

Sanjay Colony resident Ranjit Singh said, "We woke up hearing screams and calls for help. The colony guard at the gate shouted and came running for life. Within minutes, an announcement was made, but it was too late to save anything."

"I have just finished storing my essentials and household items on the first floor.

It has been a tough night for us. The administration has really helped with ration and other items, while Army officials have been keeping a vigil," said a Punjabi University professor.

"The water took away everything. We felt it was the end of the world. It was like witnessing death," said Rajbir Singh.

Meanwhile, Harish Dharpure, a 20-year old student of a Rajpura-based private university, drowned on Sunday night following water release into the SYL, which entered the university campus.

As per information, Harish fell in the sports ground and was hit on the head following which he could not get up or call for help. His parents reached the campus today and his body was handed over to them after a post-mortem at the Rajpura Civil Hospital.

Police officials said the victim was rushed to the hospital in the wee hours and was given first-aid. However, he could not be saved, they said. — TNS

In 3 days, tomato prices rise by ₹100

NEW DELHI, JULY 11
Following incessant rain washing away roads in many districts of Punjab, tomato price has jumped nearly Rs 100 within three days. In Barnala, the price rose from Rs 120 on Friday to Rs 197 on Monday. Similarly, in Bathinda, the price reached Rs 173, said the Centre's price monitoring division.

The Ministry of Food and Consumer Affairs data said the rates in Bathinda, Sangrur, Patiala and Barnala had skyrocketed ever since flood-like situation emerged.

Experts said the prices of tomatoes and other vegetables were likely to rise in the coming days. With landslides

in Himachal Pradesh, the transportation cost has increased three times. As of now, HP was the only state that had been supplying tomatoes to the rest of the country because harvesting of tomatoes in other states is yet to start, they said. "From Rs 12,000 per truck to transport tomatoes from Himachal, the cost has gone to nearly Rs 40,000," said a tomato wholesaler in Punjab.

Kulwinder Singh, a vegetable wholesaler at the Sanour vegetable market in Patiala, said the wholesale price of tomatoes was Rs 160 on Monday, and it would rise further since there was no fresh supply over the past few days owing to rainfall.

8 die in rain-triggered floods, govt to assess losses soon

Victims' kin to get ₹4L | 12 districts worst-affected

CHANDIGARH, JULY 11
Eight persons have lost their lives while three are missing due to rain and floods in the state so far. With thousands of acres of agriculture land being submerged in the water overflowing from the Ghaggar and the Sutlej, the Bhagwant Mann-led government has started assessing the losses.

Even as the government plans holding a special gir-dawari to assess the losses soon, the Revenue Department is ready to compensate victims of the flash floods for the loss of life of kin and cattle and damage to houses and buildings. After Mann took stock of the ground situation yesterday, he has asked the civil and police administration to gear up the relief and rescue operations.

The government will give a compensation of Rs 4 lakh to kin of the deceased. Of the eight deaths, two persons belong to Fatehgarh Sahib,

Ropar and Mohali, one death each was from Hoshiarpur and Nawanshahr.

Other than this, 22 houses have been washed away, six each in Faridkot and Hoshiarpur, three in Fatehgarh Sahib and two each in Tarn Taran, Ferozepur and Rajpura. One house in Pathankot district too has been damaged, according to a report compiled by the Revenue Department. The owners of pucca houses will get Rs 1.20 lakh. Since some cattle and goats too have been washed away, their owners

too will be compensated.

Twelve of the 23 districts - Ropar, Mohali, Patiala, Fatehgarh Sahib, Ludhiana, Moga, Faridkot, Ferozepur, Tarn Taran, Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur and Pathankot - have been the worst hit.

In Mohali, 268 villages are the worst-affected, Ropar 140 villages, Moga 30 villages, Hoshiarpur 25 villages, Ludhiana nine villages and Patiala seven villages, while 52 per cent of the population in the flooded villages of Ropar have been adversely affected.
